Exercise 2 | Dialogue (Diálogo)

Cabin attendant: You can use the camera once the seatbelt sign is switched off. We will announce it, so please refrain from using it for a while.

Mr. Thomas: Alright.

Cabin attendant: Thank you for your understanding. And could you please return your seatback and table to their original positions?

Mr. Thomas: Alright. I will.

Cabin attendant: Thank you for your cooperation.
